



To provide maritime interdiction capabilities to newly created Marine Units, the Office of Air and Marine (OAM) purchased 40-foot Sea Hunter vessels. These interim vessels will fill operational gaps at newly created units until the future Coastal Interceptor Vessel (CIV) is identified and purchased.

This class of vessel is the most powerful vessel used in law enforcement anywhere in the world and is an integral part of OAM's efforts to stop maritime smuggling into the United States.

Working in conjunction with OAM aviation assets, the Sea Hunter operates in offshore coastal waters to combat maritime smuggling and protect U.S. ports from acts of terrorism.

The Sea Hunter's three person (minimum) crews work in conjunction with DHS, DOD and other federal, state and local law enforcement agencies to accomplish the Homeland Security mission.
